

Authentic Assessment : A Graduation Exam

Read each question thoroughly. Answer all questions. Time limit: four hours. Begin immediately.

Final Exam

 HISTORY: Describe the history of religion from its origins to the present day, concentrate specifically but not exclusively, on its social, political, economic, religious, and philosophical impact on Europe, Asia, America and Africa. Demonstrate your understanding by creating your own religion and describing its likely impact on world affairs. Be brief, concise and specific.

Final Exam

 LITERATURE: Compose an epic poem based on the events of your own life in which you see and footnote allusions from T.S. Eliot, Keats, Chaucer, Dante, Norse mythology and the Marx brothers. Critique your poem with a full discussion of its metrics.

Final Exam

 MUSIC: Write a piano concerto.
Orchestrate it and perform it with flute and drum. You will find a piano under your seat.



Final Exam

BIOLOGY: Create life. Estimate the differences in subsequent human culture if this form of life had developed five hundred years earlier, with special attention to the probable effects on the English Parliamentary system. Prove your thesis.



Setting the Stage for Grades

How do we ask the question?

- 1. Who was the 17th President of the United States?
- · Short answer format
- Fewer than 10% of students able to answer correctly

- 2. Who was the 17th President of the United States?
 - A. Abraham Lincoln
 - B. Andrew Johnson
 - C. Ulysses S. Grant
 - D. Millard Fillmore
- Approximately 30% able to answer correctly
- If all students were to simply chose an answer at random, multiple choice format would allow 25% to answer correctly.

- 3. Who was the 17th President of the United States?
 - A. George Washington
 - B. Andrew Johnson
 - C. Jimmy Carter
 - D. Bill Clinton
- Approximately 60% able to answer correctly
- Those who are still unable to answer correctly probably have a limited knowledge of US Presidents.

- 4. Who was the 17th President of the United States?
 - A. The War of 1812
 - B. Andrew Johnson
 - C. The Louisiana Purchase
 - D. A Crazy Day for Sally
- Approximately 90% able to answer correctly
- Those who do not are usually drawn to answer "D" because they recognize it as the one response that doesn't belong with the others.


